




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# Letter From Our President





# 175+ Years of History

Born in 1846 on the island of Oʻahu, Victoria Ward was a champion of Hawai'i. She embraced Mālama 'Āina, the Hawaiian tradition of restoring and cultivating the land, and envisioned her sprawling 100-acre estate as a natural sanctuary where the community could celebrate the culture and the beauty of her beloved homeland.

The lands that were once a peaceful sanctuary between the two growing population centers of Downtown Honolulu and Waikīkī, have evolved into Ward Village, a flourishing gathering place that's forward thinking and community-focused. By about one block per year, these 60 acres of Honolulu's oceanfront land have transformed into a designforward neighborhood for all.

Our team is dedicated to nurturing the sustainable development of this land and honoring its distinct history. Thus, Ward Village targets responsible development, greener buildings, and resilient infrastructure. On top of building distinct residential condominiums using the world's leading architects—including market homes and reserved housing for Hawai'i residents—Ward Village also offers a variety of community

Here, residents, the larger community, and visitors alike can experience the unique retail offerings, public art displays, and more than 150,000 square feet of green space. Plus, there are over 2,600 public parking stalls and 116,000 square feet of services. Through residential and commercial development, we are proudly supporting local job and business creation.





# Our Neighborhood Ward Village Hawai'i

With a LEED for Neighborhood Development (LEED ND)

Platinum certification, sustainable community development is at the forefront of this master planned community.

While honoring the distinct history of the land, Ward Village integrates striking architecture, culture and arts, and public green spaces. And throughout its development, Ward Village has preserved key features of the natural environment, incorporating them into smart, resilient design that conserves resources and incorporates climate resiliency.

Celebrating the spirit of Hawai'i and the vibrance of our residents, Ward Village hosts a variety of social programs and events, and also supports the organizations and individuals who are shaping the future of this community and the wider Honolulu area.

Named by *Architectural Digest* in 2017 as "Best Planned Community in the United States," at full build out, Ward Village will include approximately one million square feet of unique retail space, thousands of homes, and green space galore.



Ward Village hosts a Halloween celebration at Victoria Ward Park that features a pumpkin patch, a Halloween mask decorating station, shave ice, and photo opportunities.

### **NOVEMBER**

The Gift of Experience returns for the holiday season, offering shoppers the chance to receive two tickets to their choice of the Waikīkī Aguarium or 'Iolani Palace.

A festive fall celebration is held at Victoria Ward Park featuring a cookie decorating station, taro donuts from Holey Grail Donuts and a fall-themed photo wall.

## **DECEMBER**

Guests create new traditions at Ward Village, enjoying holiday surprises from strolling musicians to nutcracker stilt walkers, workshops, festive decorations, and music-filled streets, providing family fun through the end of the year.

Ward Village invites the community to join Toys for Tots' mission to provide hope to local children and drop off new, unwrapped toys at the donation bins within South Shore Market or Ward Centre.

The community is invited to take part in the Ward Village Elf Scavenger Hunt.

The Aloha Friday Music Series comes back to the South Shore Market Courtyard for the holidays. Every Friday in December, guests enjoy live holiday music from local artists including Honoka, Micah Ganiron, and more.

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# Sustainable Initiatives


Ward Village honors the beauty and value of this ocean-front community, and monitoring resilience for the future.

Ward Village was one of only two U.S. properties profiled in World Green Building Council's November 2022 report, "Beyond the Business Case: Why You Can't Afford Not to Invest in a Sustainable Built Environment." This global report highlighted the community's LEED ND Platinum certification achieved through thoughtful design.

While honoring the distinct history of the land, Ward Village integrates striking architecture, culture and arts, and public green spaces. Throughout its development, Ward Village has preserved key features of the natural environment, incorporating them into a smart, resilient design that conserves resources and incorporates climate resiliency.

To further enhance the neighborhood and make a positive impact on the surrounding environment, we've added native, culturally-inspired landscaping within Ward Village's parks, which help reduce water usage and support the restoration of more native plants. These green spaces and tree canopies were virtually nonexistent during previous periods of industrial land use, and now create shade, encourage bike riding and walking, lessen hardscape overheating, and reduce the overall temperature of the neighborhood.

# SUSTAINABLE SPOTLIGHT

# Thoughtful Design at Kōʻula

Ward Village's sixth residential tower, *Kōʻula is just one example of how we are* prioritizing sustainable development.

Sustainability in design and build was a priority at Kōʻula, and since its opening, there have been significant savings on energy, water consumption, and costs. Thanks to low-flow plumbing fixtures, water-efficient mechanical equipment, and low-irrigation landscaping, residents and tenants spend 25.2% less on energy compared to similar buildings, and use 35% less water than baseline national standards.

The 41-story tower pays tribute to the native plant of which it's named after—red sugar cane—whose twisting appearance informed the design of its exterior. To create the distinctive, wave-like appearance of the building's facade, famed architect and Urban Land Institute Laureate Jeanne Gang and her company Studio Gang, designed an innovative structural system that produced column-free interiors with flexible layouts. This unique design feature allows each residence to angle toward the coastline and capture idyllic views in every direction. In addition, the design provides support and self-shading, keeping temperatures comfortable for each residence's private lānai and improving environmental performance.

Kōʻula has been a great success, and is another representation of how Ward Village is moving forward on the master plan to design a collection of residences with a walkable urban core and a community gathering place.

# SUSTAINABLE SPOTLIGHT Biodiversity

As stewards of this land, we support the health of its flora and fauna to provide beautiful outdoor spaces for the enjoyment of our community members and to protect the environment.

With an unwavering responsibility to the natural world, our planning and development efforts at Ward Village include amenities for our residents and the community at large, including parks, dedicated bike paths, wide tree-lined sidewalks, and more.

To further demonstrate our commitment to green space and to the planet, we introduced 'ohana planting at Ward Village, a multi-species agroforestry planting system that is based on the traditional Pacific Island practice. The result of this practice—grouping street trees in plant families or 'ohana groups—provides visual and experiential interest, increases biodiversity, and showcases a lush, more natural habitat within the community. 'Ohana planting also assists with stormwater uptake and provides a comfortable, shaded refuge.

## **EARTH DAY**

Ward Village and Sustainable Farm & Brew celebrated Earth Day 2022 at South Shore Market. The community participated in an interactive build-your-own herb box while learning about sustainable farming and gardening

Earth Day gives us an opportunity to raise awareness about environmental issues and inspire action to protect the planet. It's so important to integrate sustainable habits into our daily lives for the well-being of our planet and future generations. As a community-focused organization, we understand that small changes in our habits can create a significant cumulative impact on the environment. # Committed to Community

Ward Village aims to help build up our community through donations of funds and time. In September 2022, Ward Village pledged \$150,000 to six local nonprofits to celebrate the opening of Kōʻula, our sixth residence:

- \$25,000 for Trees for Honolulu's Future to facilitate the planting and careful maintenance of new and existing trees in communities across O'ahu.
- \$25,000 for Surfrider Spirit Sessions to create and implement holistic, ocean-based education, mentoring programs, and activities that support at-risk and adjudicated youth.
- \$25,000 for Historic Hawai'i Foundation to support its efforts in the preservation of historic buildings, sites, and communities relating to the history of Hawai'i in urban Honolulu.
- \$25,000 for Hawai'i Home Ownership Center to support its efforts to provide education, information, and support for first-time homeowners in Hawai'i.
- \$25,000 for University of Hawai'i Foundation to provide scholarships for students studying urban and regional planning, engineering, and architecture.
- \$25,000 for Hawai'i Youth Symphony to support the "Music in the Clubhouse" program, which provides instructional workshops, instruments, and sheet music for local families and keiki.

These contributions stem from a long-term partnership with the Hawai'i Community Foundation to support critical community priorities. Ward Village continues to pledge gifts aligned with development milestones, including groundbreaking, topping off and home sales. For every new home sold within the Ward Village master planned community, a \$500 contribution is made by Ward Village, with new homeowners also having the opportunity to participate with a matching gift.

To date, Ward Village has distributed more than \$3.8 million to over 180 of Hawai'i's critical nonprofit organizations, and this new pledge reinforces its commitment to giving back to the community.





# Giving through Doing

The team at Ward Village is committed to continuing to support nonprofit partners who are improving the wellbeing of the environment, community, and people who live here. "As a part of this community, we feel a deep sense of responsibility to give to Hawai'i and invest in its future," said Ka'iulani Sodaro, Senior Vice President of Planning & Development at Ward Village. Therefore, on top of donating monetarily, we also donate our time.

Some of our favorite volunteer moments of 2022 include painting and cleaning KCAA Muriel Preschool ahead of its reopening, working alongside women volunteers from the Habitat for Humanity—Wahine Build initiative to construct a house in Waimānalo for a local family, supporting Hāwea Heiau and Keawāwa Wetland during A Day on the Land, and participating in the 15th Annual Kewalo Basin Park clean up with Friends of the Kewalo.



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
